- Bernie's Book Bank this charity distributes books for children up to 12 years old in the Chicago and surrounding 6 counties. They are currently serving 360,000 children with their program. Books are sourced via donations of used books and purchase from publishers.
- Cradles to Crayons this charity accepts donations of new and gently used clothes and necessities for some 60,000 children in Chicago. Volunteers inspect, sort and assemble packages of goods based on "shopping lists" based on the needs of the children served.
- SparkShop this charity developed and runs a program to introduce 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade children to various engineering fields. They are currently at 13 schools in Chicago with funding going towards adding more. The provide direct presentation and workshops to the class and then assist teachers with continuing involvement.
