

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
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

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Rallye 'Round the Region

In this issue we are going to start discussing traps. The next rallye is scheduled for June 4, 2000. Dan Gallagher, Rallymaster for this rallye, has stated numerous times that we had better know our ONTO because he is going to have a lot of them on this rallye. With his okay, I am going to try to explain this trap to you in hopes that you will be able to keep on course and get a good score.

The ONTO (Main Road Rule (MRR)) is used frequently in rallyes and each Rallymaster has a variety of requirements that have to be met for this MRR to work on their particular rallye. Basically, the ONTO reads something like this: When you are instructed ONTO a named road by the term ONTO and the name of the road, a road bearing that designation is the MAIN ROAD. You must stay on that road or re-enter that road by designation until it is cancelled.

It is the prerogative of the Rallymaster to set up the rules that determine how he wants you to execute this MRR. He can decide how and when he wants it cancelled during the rallye (if at all) and he can decide just how you are to enter or re-enter the ONTO. I have listed below the descriptions from several different rallyes, so that you can get an idea what to look for when using this type of MRR.

 ONTO: When you are instructed ONTO a named road by the term ONTO and the name of a road, a road bearing that designation is the MAIN ROAD until you execute a left, right, turn or straight in a route instruction. (COMMENT: A numbered route instruction giving a CAST (change average speed to) does not take you off of the ONTO. The CAST does not change direction of travel).

- 2. ONTO: After being placed ONTO a road by name or number, remain on that road until the route instructions direct otherwise. (COMMENT: Different wording but means the same.)
- 3. ONTO: When placed ONTO a road by name or number follow that



road until taken off of it by a numbered route following instruction, that is, an instruction that causes you to change your direction from the obvious route, not a CAST change. (COMMENT: Same meaning).

4. ONTO: When placed on a road by the word ONTO, you must follow or re-enter that road if it is encountered again, until another ONTO is executed or the ONTO is cancelled. Only one ONTO can be valid at a time. EXAMPLE: RI says, Right onto Langdon Rd. At anytime thereafter, that you have the opportunity to follow or re-enter Langdon Rd. you are obligated to follow or re-enter Lang-

don Rd. to stay on course, until you are placed ONTO another road or the onto is canceled. (COMMENT: Same meaning but has a few more requirements -- only working on one ONTO at a time.)

5. ONTO: ONTO is a MAIN ROAD rule that says if you execute a route instruction that directs you upon a road by use of the term 'onto' and the designation of the road, you are to stay on or re-enter that road by designation until you execute a route instruction that takes you off the MAIN ROAD. (COMMENT: Same meaning.)

There must be a unique 'onto' road to follow for this rule to apply. In other words, if you come to an opportunity to re-enter the road but it goes both right and left, and you were not given a specific direction of travel to re-enter the road, you must continue straight or use another MRR. If the GENERALS state "YOU ARE TO RE-ENTER IT IN THE SAME DIRECTION AS THE ORIGINAL INSTRUCTION" i.e. right, left, north, south, etc., then you must re-enter the ONTO in the direction initially used. READ THE GENERALS CAREFULLY. The ONTO can be cancelled by numerous methods. As #4 above states only one ONTO can be valid at a time. It can also be cancelled by a Special Instruction given to you at the checkpoint or by some other means stated in the GENERALS. Or it may never be cancelled and remain active throughout the Rallye. Thus, post-it notes on the dash are mandatory.

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COME OUT AND PLAY II

This is part two of the two-part series with the purpose of helping members become more familiar with the terms and jargon used in the Porsche Club.

This month, I had included general car terms, information, and interesting techniques, grouped alphabetically. This is far from being an all-inclusive list. Any suggestions or inquiries are welcome, and I will be happy to add them to future editions. E-mail your additions to nowakowskim@permapipe.com

Balaclava: A lining, made of Nomex or other fire retardant material, worn under a helmet, used to protect the head and neck.

Brake Pads: The consumable portion of the brake system. Brake pads rub against the brake rotor, creating friction, which slows the vehicle.

CF: Abbreviation for Coefficient of Friction. A way of comparing the grip of different tires by measuring the ratio at which a tire converts download to traction.

CG: Abbreviation for Center of Gravity. The point within an object where it is exactly balanced in all directions.

Chicago Region Technical Inspection (Tech Inspection): Visual inspection of participating vehicles at a PCA Chicago Region event, to ensure safety of driver and vehicle. Emphasis on tires, wheels, brakes, functioning brake lights, suspension, wheel bearings, brake fluid, and removal of all loose items from vehicle. Helmet is examined for compliance with SA Snell date ratings. See PCA Chicago Region Technical Inspection Sheet for addition requirements.

Constant Radius Corner: A corner defined by a single radius throughout the length of the corner.

Decreasing Radius Corner: A corner where the first section of the turn has a larger radius than the second.

Double Clutch Downshifting (Heel-&-Toe Downshifting): A series of maneuvers performed while downshifting, to synchronize gears, without grinding. With your foot on the brake, you push in the clutch and shift to neutral from a higher gear. You let the clutch out, and then, still in neutral, and with the brake applied, you blip the throttle. Since, with the clutch engaged, the engine is directly connected to the input shaft, your blip easily spins up the engine to a higher RPM. The instant after the throttle blip, push in the clutch and move the gear lever to the next lower gear position. Once in the next lower gear, let the clutch back out again. This shift to a lower gear must occur quickly, before the extra RPM created by the blip falls away. It helps to think of double clutching as doing two normal shifts. The first is a shift to neutral, and the second is a shift to a lower gear. The shift to neutral is like any other shift-clutch in, move gear lever, clutch out. The next half of the double clutch is simply another normal shift-clutch in, move the gear lever to the next lowest gear, clutch out. The only difference is that when you stop in neutral, you give the engine a blip.

Drafting: A technique of following closely behind another vehicle to take advantage of the hole the leading vehicle cuts into the air. Since the trailing car does not have to work as hard against air resistance, it can often overtake the lead car.

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Flags: Used to alert drivers to track conditions.

Black: Pull into pit for consultation.

Black with Orange Circle: Pull into pits, you may have mechanical problems with your car.

Blue with Yellow Diagonal Stripe: Passing Flag. Car(s) following closely behind you and will be passing

you.

Checkered: Completion of race or session.

Green: Indicates the start of an event, and the track is open.

Red: Safely, stop on track immediately.

Red and Yellow Alternating Horizontal Stripes: Debris, oil, or other substance on track. Caution, slippery or hazardous conditions exist.

White: Service vehicle on track ahead.

Stationary Yellow: Warm up or cool down lap, or, indicates some unsafe condition ahead, slow down, no passing.

Waving Yellow: Indicates immediate danger, slow down, no passing, and be prepared to avoid problems ahead.

g: Abbreviation for the force that gravity exerts on an object. Used as a reference point to compare the acceleration force of a vehicle. The force of gravity will accelerate a body at 32 feet per second per second ($1g = 32 \text{ ft/sec}^2$).

Hairpin: Arbitrarily defined as a corner with more than 120 degrees of direction change.

Increasing Radius Corner: A corner where the radius of the beginning section of the corner is tighter than the radius of the later section.

Kevlar: A light, strong, composite material that is a form of carbon fiber.

Kink: A jog in the road, normally found on part of a straight.

Neck Collars: Worn between helmet and shoulders, made of fire retardant padded materials, used to restrict helmet motion during acceleration and deceleration.

Naturally Aspirated: Term referring to the manner in which air reaches the combustion chamber of an engine. A normally aspirated engine has no mechanical aids to increase air pressure above the ambient level.

Nomex: A fire retardant material fabric.

Red Line: Refers to the maximum revolutions at which an engine can be run without risking failure.

Rotor: The "disc" portion in disc brakes. A circular plate against which the brake pads squeeze, creating friction which slows the car.

RPM (or Revs): Abbreviation for Revolutions Per Minute. A measure of how fast something is rotating.

Slicks: Tires which have a treadless surface, allowing the greatest amount of rubber to be in contact with the road surface at the contact patch, creating the greatest grip. Used in dry conditions.

The Line: Theoretically, the fastest way around a turn, race track or road course.

Throttle Blip: In order to perform a proper downshift, the engine revs must be increased to allow smooth engagement of the next lowest gear. The "blip" is a sudden jab of the throttle pedal, usually done with part of the driver's right foot, to temporarily increase the engine revs. The function of the blip is to smooth out the clutch engagement during the shift to the next lowest gear. The throttle blip cushions the clutch engagement and synchronizes the speeds of the transmission input and output shafts.

Throttle Steer: Applying the gas to introduce a steering action. Usually while exiting from a turn.

Trailing Throttle Oversteer: The tendency for a vehicle to develop oversteer if the throttle is lifted, while the car is near its cornering limit.

Turbocharging: A method of increasing the amount and pressure of fuel and air in an engine. A turbocharger is a pump that is turned by exhaust gases. The pump sucks in air and forces it into the combustion chamber with the fuel at increase pressure, thus increasing power output.

Blackhawk Farms Raceway, South Beloit, IL Thursday May 18, 2000—Experienced Blackhawk drivers ONLY. Friday, May 19, 2000—Novices, Women, & Instructors* ONLY.

Blackhawk Farms Raceway is a nine turn 1.8 mile enclosed high speed track located in South Beloit, just outside of Rockton, Illinois close to the Northwest Tollway.

Mandatory clothing for all drivers at this event include a Snell approved SA 1990 helmet, long sleeve shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not necessary items include driving suits, driving gloves, driving shoes, and protective neck brace all made of Nomex or similar fire-resistant materials. Please check the dates on your helmets now. There will NOT be loaner helmets available. If your helmet does not pass inspection, you will not drive.

To save time at the track, you may bring a completed Chicago region Tech sheet signed by a recognized Porsche dealer or mechanic. Be certain to pay close attention to the specifics concerning brake fluid and pads.

Every Blackhawk event is a sell out. Please pre-register (with payment) to ensure a spot in these events. Waiting lists will be used to fill open spots.

Thursday is for experienced Blackhawk drivers only!

Friday is for novices, women, and instructors only! Novices will be divided into groups for classroom sessions, track observation sessions at various turns, and ontrack sessions with instructors. The groups will alternate between the classroom, observation and critique of other driving groups, and in-car instruction. This day is planned as a low-key driving education experience for first time drivers. Instructors* will be assigned to each novice.

There will be a dinner following each day's event at The Prime Spot (near the track and I-90).



Road America Drivers' Education 2000

May 26-28, 2000

We're pleased to announce the Chicago Region's first event of the new century at historic Road America in Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin. This will be the first of our two events at Road America this year, which is open to all Porsche drivers including novices. If you are a novice, we strongly suggest that you attend the Spring Drivers' School on April 14th as well as the Drivers' School at Blackhawk Farms Raceway on May 19th before participating in this event.

Road America is made up of fourteen turns, three long straights, and four total miles of winding track through the Kettle Moraine area of central Wisconsin making it one of the most scenic and exciting racetracks in North America. Our format this year is slightly different than in years past as we were able to add a third day to the schedule. The first day of the event, Friday, May 26th, will be open EXCLUSIVELY to Novice drivers and Instructors allowing us to offer a very high level of instruction for up to 50 novices. If you are a novice driver and want to participate in this event, please send in your registration today as this event is traditionally a sell out!

All novice drivers will receive classroom instruction provided by the Skip Barber team on Friday, along with controlled car handling exercises. Each novice will be assigned a PCA Instructor for the event who will help guide you safely through the weekend and help you to improve your driving skills. All novice drivers will also be required to attend a *Novice Orientation Meeting* on Thursday evening, May 25th at Siebkens at 8:00 PM.

There will be four run groups on Saturday and Sunday. Group 1 – our most experienced drivers with usually, but not always, the fastest cars; Groups 2 & 3 – our next most experienced drivers who are somewhat slower than Group 1; and Group 4 – our novice drivers and others who are still fairly new to Road America.

Using the Chicago Region Tech Sheet it is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car yourself, or better yet, have it checked by a competent mechanic prior to the event. Be sure to pay close attention to the specifics detailed on the tech sheet concerning brake fluid and brake pads.

For Groups 1, 2, and 3, a five or six point harness is mandatory for the driver, and if you wish to have an instructor ride with you, the same type of harness is required on the passenger's side. Mandatory clothing for this event include: a <u>SNELL</u> approved <u>SA 1995</u> helmet, long sleeve cotton shirt, long pants, socks, all

made of non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not mandatory are driver's suits, driving gloves and shoes, and a protective neck brace all made of Nomex or similar fire-resistant materials and a mounted fire extinguisher. Please check the date on your helmet *NOW*, as it will be checked at tech inspection. Remember that if you do not pass tech inspection, you will not be permitted to drive.

The registrar will assign car numbers prior to the event and *All* cars must display those numbers on each side of the car and on the front hood. Numbers must be at least 6" tall on the sides and at least 8" tall on the hood. Shoe polish is not acceptable! If the corner workers cannot read your numbers, you will be black-flagged and will not be allowed out again until the deficiency is corrected. Once you have received your number assignment from the registrar, we recommend that you find a local sign shop that can create inexpensive static cling numbers.

All cars participating in this event must not exceed the Road America noise restriction of 108 dB. Please ensure that your car is in compliance with this limit. There are residential areas near the track, and Road America personnel will be monitoring our cars throughout the weekend. Included in your packets will be a copy of the Rules of Road America. Please take a few moments to read them before the start of the weekend so you can ensure that you the driver, your family, crew, and friends will comply with these rules. These rules are the landlord's, not ours. So, please help us comply.

In addition to the mandatory Novice Orientation Meeting on Thursday evening, there will be a *Mandatory Drivers' Meeting* on Friday for Novices and Instructors, and Saturday & Sunday mornings for *ALL* drivers to be held at the track at 7:45 AM sharp. Any driver who misses any of these meetings that address safety issues and policy for the weekend will not be allowed to drive.

Speaking of safety, as part of the registration form this year we are asking all participants to provide some personal medical information. We, as a Region, are taking a proactive approach to your personal well-being. This information will be kept confidential and will only be provided to the track physician in the remote possibility it is needed.

Spaces for the event are limited, so we recommend that you *pre-register early!* Pre-registration will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. You will be

notified by the registrar of your acceptance by e-mail or mail. Now would be an excellent time to call one of the listed hotels for accommodations as they tend to sell out quickly on holiday weekends. Please note that we have a block of rooms reserved at The Osthoff.

Track registration and Tech Inspection for Novices and Instructors will be open at Siebkens on Thursday, May 25th from 4:00 - 7:00 PM. Registration and Tech Inspection for all other drivers will be at the Registration Building and the Tech Barn at Road America from 4:00 -7:00 PM on Friday, May 26th. Please remember that you must present a valid driver's license and your PCA membership card at registration. The tech crew will scrutinize your car and your helmet. If your car is not teched on Thursday or Friday afternoon, it must be teched at the track in the morning following the Drivers' Meeting. No car will be allowed to run without a tech approval sticker.

Siebkens will be the headquarters for the Thursday registration and tech inspection as well as the Novice Orientation Meeting. In addition to lodging, they also offer a continental breakfast starting at 6:00 AM and a full

service breakfast starting at June 1. be on hand during Thursday evening's registration to sell tickets to a dinner that will be available in their dining room on Saturday evening after the track closes.

New this year, Road America is offering golf cart rentals to our participants. If you are interested, please make your reservations at least four weeks prior to the event. Please note that you will be responsible for any damage to the cart and Road America requires a minimum age of 16 to operate the golf carts.
