Here's your opportunity to practice all that you've learned in drivers school in the complete safety of an enclosed high-speed track. Blackhawk is an eight turn 1.8 mile track that is located just outside of Rockton, Illinois close to the Northwest Tollway. Learn to drive your Porsche or other vehicle at high speed in complete safety. At these events we allow cars other than Porsches to participate. We are not suggesting that you bring the family station wagon, but sports cars and sporting type cars that pass tech will be permitted.

PREPARING FOR BLACKHAWK

In the twenty-five years I have been the event chairman of Blackhawk, I have learned a few things. I admit I am very stubborn and never made Phi Betta Kappa but I have learned that the most important thing you can have at Blackhawk is brakes, brakes and more brakes.

Blackhawk is a short track (1.8 miles) and your brakes do not have the chance to cool down as much as they would have at tracks such as Elkhart. The fastest Porsche out there accelerates from zero to sixty in about five seconds where the slowest one can decelerate from sixty to zero in around three seconds.

What does this tell you? The brake pedal is much more important than the loud pedal.

As I don't want to pull your car from the weeds at corner one because your brakes went away as your pads wore out or you boiled your brake fluid. Pay attention to the following recommendations.

Brakes stop a car by slowing its forward motion by friction of the brake pads against the rotor, this produces heat. The faster the stop, the greater the heat. This heat must go somewhere. It goes in the air, the rotor, the pads and the brake fluid.

I am not a engineer but I have been informed that brakes work best at a temperature of around 900 degrees. This heat wears down pads at a fast rate. It is for this reason that semi-metallic (race pads) and the new carbon fiber pads were developed. These pads are terrific for the track but not very good for the street as they really don't like to work until they reach 500 degrees. Therefore, my first recommendation is for a new set of factory pads. Not only are they better for the street but they also do not wear out your rotors as fast. Please be aware that it takes some time to "bed" in your new pads on your old rotors or for that matter on new rotors. Pads and rotors must get use to each other. I recommend several hundred street miles or at least five moderate laps around the track before any hot laps.

The average driver at Blackhawk puts close to 120 miles on the track. This is equivalent to 70% of the life of a set of street pads. See why I recommend you have a good set of pads before you show up.

Next and maybe even more important is your brake fluid. The function of brake fluid is to cause the pads to squeeze the rotor, slowing the car. As I mentioned earlier this causes heat, a great deal of which is transferred to the brake fluid. The important thing to know about brake fluid is that it boils and when that happens you don't stop. Most brake fluid boils at about 400 degrees. Fortunately the fluid in your Porsche is better than that.

However, brake fluid gets old, dirty and absorbs water. We all know at what temperature water boils. I recommend that you change your fluid and put in a good DOT 5 fluid, this will increase the boiling point to 500 degrees or better. I do not recommend silicone brake fluid. I know it has a very high boiling point (700 degrees) and does not absorb water, I don't like it because it eats up rubber seals. Unless, you want to change all your seals and go serious racing don't use it, besides it is harder than hell to bleed it.

Please follow these few inexpensive brake recommendations and change your oil prior to coming out. I recommend 20 W 50 or a straight weight 40 quality motor oil.

GO GET TECHED

EXACTLY WHAT'S A TECH INSPECTION, WHERE CAN I GET ONE, AND HOW MUCH ARE THEY?

WHEN YOU COME TO YOUR FIRST AUTOCROSS OR TRACK EVENT SOMEONE WILL ASK YOU IF HAVE HAD YOUR CAR TECHED YET. MOST FIRST TIMERS REPLY THAT "NO ITS PERFECTLY STOCK EXCEPT FOR THE EXHAUST". THE PROPER ANSWER IS "WHERE'S THE TECH LINE?"

SO FIND THE LINE AND FILL OUT AND SIGN A PCA/CHICAGO TECH INSPECTION SHEET. THERE IS NORMALLY A COPY OF THIS IN EACH CHICAGO SCENE. The first Road America driving school of the year is soon to be a reality. The usual procedures will be in place...run groups alternating every half hour of open track lapping. Plenty of track time to practice those turns, learn those lines and have fun.

The first Road America becomes even more fun this year because the Chicago Region is going racing again on the Labor Day weekend. This would be a perfect time for the racers to learn the Road America track and set-up their cars for the racing event.

On Friday night, May 26th, the novice drivers will be required to attend the novice drivers meeting at Siebken's. On Saturday, the novice drivers must attend a half day Skip Barber drivers school to learn the proper driving techniques for cornering, braking, safety practices, and the safe negotiation of the track. The novices will then have the opportunity to drive the track while being observed and critiqued by Skip Barber instructors and accompanied by their personal PCA instructors, then they will be able to join in the alternating run groups for the rest of the weekend.

Again, all corners will be staffed by professional SCCA corner worker. The corner workers will be strictly enforcing the rules of passing (restricted to certain straight aways), with no passing being allowed in the braking areas or turns.

Using your Chicago Region Tech Sheet, it is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car yourself, or have it checked by a competent service organization immediately prior to the event. Be sure to pay close attention to the specifics on the tech sheet concerning brake fluids and brake pads.

The mandatory clothing requirements remain that a 1985 Snell approved helmet (PLEASE NOTE..WE REPEAT..A 1985 SNELL APPROVED HELMET), a long sleeved shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of a non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not mandatory, are drivers suits and driving gloves made of nonflammable materials, fire extinguisher, and a safety harness.

Once each day there will be an opportunity to run Parade laps with your family or other passengers over 18 years of age wearing a 1985 Snell approved helmet and appropriate clothing and wearing a seat belt. Speed will be contained by a use of pace cars and any make of car is acceptable as long as it is in appropriate condition.

Again, there will be a MANDATORY NOVICE DRIVERS MEETING at Siebkens promptly at 8:00 pm Friday evening. The novices will be given general instructions as well as pertinent information as to the format and rules of the event. All novices MUST attend this meeting or they will not be allowed to drive.

The Saturday and Sunday MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETINGS will be at 7:30 am at the track. ANYONE MISSING THE MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETINGS WILL NOT DRIVE.

Registration opens at Siebkens on Friday afternoon at 4:00 pm. The tech crew will be on hand to scrutinize your car. If your car is not teched at Siebkens on Friday, it must be teched at the track on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. No car will be allowed to run without a tech sticker.

A sellout is a "sure thing" for this event, so please register early. You will be notified of your acceptance by mail by the registrar. Also, please remember that you must present a VALID DRIVERS LICENSE at the time of registration.

NEW THIS YEAR AND FOR ALL FUTURE ROAD AMERICA EVENTS, ROAD AMERICA HAS IMPOSED A NOISE LEVEL RESTRICTION. THE RESTRICTION IS 108DB FOR ALL CARS. ROAD AMERICA ITSELF WILL BE MONITORING THIS NOISE RESTRICTION, AND IF YOUR AUTOMOBILE EXCEEDS THE LIMITS, ROAD AMERICA WILL ASK YOU TO LEAVE.

Also new this year are restrictions from Road America about roller blades and skateboards are prohibited.

Siebkens will be again be the "headquarters" for the non-track meetings. Contact Siebkens directly for lodging reservations (414-876-2600). Dinner reservations for Saturday night can be made at the same time as room reservations, but please no latter than Friday evening, May 26th. Dinner choices are Weinerschnitzel, Duck, Prime Rib, and Fresh Fish if ordered in advance.

METAL PARADISE

thousands upon thousand of automotive parts. A Marvel Comic description of their automatic six-stage machine would be "the thing that goes klunk, bang, blam, boom, kapow and spit day in and



day out.." Holy metal mecca–after klunk, bang, blam, boom kapow and spit, finished parts are made at a rate of sixty pieces per minutel Awesome.

QUALITY CONTROL

Well, as marvelous as that sounds, it is not the heart of what Tro is all about. Anyone with any type of engineeing or technical background will know that these machines are only as good as the people who run them. Quality control at the machines' "spit" operation is critical. I've been involved in product

development for over thirty years andafter inspecting quite a number of Tro's parts, I found them to be as perfect as humanly possible.

ASSEMBLY SERVICE

Tro also stamps multiple parts and assembles them. This is another added service because so many

products require multiple stampings and the last thing an assembly house wants to do is buy extra heavy equipment when stampings make up only a small portion of theirproduct's components. So, if you're in the market for great metal stampings, give Lad a call-lam sure he can give you a super value at the quality you expect from one of the top stamping houses in the Chicago area.

Since you have pulled your Porsche apart for autocrossing, Pete suggests you proceed with the polishing. Although prizes for PCA sponsored pristine Porsche pageants are predicated upon cleanliness, Porsches should be presented in their completed phorm for pristine Porsche competitions. Please put your Porsche pieces back in place before competing in Pete's Pre-Parade Punctiliously Pristine Porsche Pageant Plus Pleasantly Perplexing Panoramic Passage.

Prior to preparing your pristine Porsche, the concours pupil should ponder the appropriate class in which to participate at Pete's Pre-Parade Punctiliously Pristine Porsche Pageant Plus Pleasantly Perplexing Panoramic Passage.
