



#### **REAR VIEW MIRROR**

#### Reflecting by Mike Mullins

#### 4th Annual Loop & Baseball Rallye by Nick Brenkus

We found last year's rallye to be challenging, especially with 70 some-odd bonus questions that need to be answered in between route instructions, and since the morning greeted us with typical Gallagher weather, we decided to take our chances. 


