



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


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Road America II Labor Day Weekend September 2, 3 & 4, 1994

Road America II is fast approaching and there are a few changes that will be in effect for this weekend. The first change and one of the most important is the dates. Please note that it is a 3 day event this year...Friday, Saturday and Sunday. This is because Road America II and the PCA Club Racing will be held as a joint event. The usual procedures will be in place with run groups alternating every half hour, with passing allowed only in designated areas. Each driver will have one or two more driving sessions than on a normal Road America weekend, but they will be spread out over the three days of the event.

Another change for the Labor Day event is that only experienced driver will be accepted to participate in the event. There will be no novice drivers, or novice run groups on this weekend.

Spaces are limited, and I highly recommend that you register early. You will be notified of our acceptance by mail by the registrar. Also, please remember that you must present a valid drivers license and your <u>PCA membership</u> card at registration.

All corners will be staffed by professional SCCA corner workers. The corner workers will be strictly enforcing the passing rules with no passing being allowed in the corners.

Using your Chicago Region Tech Sheet, it is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car yourselves, or have it checked by a competent service organization immediately prior to the event. Be sure to pay close attention to the specifics on the tech sheet concerning brake fluids and brake pads.

The mandatory clothing requirements, i.e., a 1985 Snell approved helmet, long sleeved shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not mandatory, are drivers suits and driving gloves made of nonflammable materials, fire extinguishers, and a safety harness.

The Friday, Saturday and Sunday MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETINGS will be held at 7:30 AM at the track. Anyone missing the mandatory drivers meetings will not drive.

Registration opens at road America on Thursday afternoon at 4:00 to 8:00 PM. PM. The tech crew will be on hand to scrutinize your car, until dusk. If your car is not teched at Road America on Thursday, it must be teched at the track on Friday morning starting at 7:30 AM. No car will be allowed to run without a tech sticker.

Siebkins will again be the headquarters for the non-track meetings. Contact Siebkins directly for lodging reservations (414-876-2600). Dinner reservations for Saturday night can be made at the same time as room reservations, but please no latter that September 2nd. Dinner choices, ordered in advance are: Weinerschnitzel, Duck, Prime Rib, and Fresh Fish.

Continental breakfast will be available at 6:00 AM, with full service breakfast starting at 9:00 AM. Siebkins is attempting to provide full service breakfast earlier for he drivers, but this information will only be available at registration.





CONTEMPORARY ITALIAN CUISINE

For some reason, I always thought Dan and Linda's Bella Vista restaurant was in or near Naperville. I mentioned their New Years Eve Party to my wife, Judith, but she didn't want to drive that far so we stayed closer to home. When I finally called to have dinner at the Bella Vista, I was told it was in Lake View and proceeded to ask for directions; however, I just couldn't comprehend them because it sounded like he said the restaurant was near the Lake, so I asked, facetiously, if that was Lake Michigan and got a positive response. To my surprise I learned that the restaurant was on the north side of the Loop and only twenty minutes from my home in Evanston. Upon recovering from that surprise, we received another very pleasant one as we entered a stunning multi-level dining area with three temperature controlled walk-in wine rooms (they keep some 50,000 bottles of wine available at the restaurant.)

When visualizing a restaurant with space for 320 patrons, a country buffet comes to mind. Yet, Dan and Linda have negated this image by breaking up the areas using the wine rooms as dividers between the casual dining area and bar and the more formal area and by creating multi-levels. There are two mezzanine levels and balcony dining on three sides. The views are spectacular! The second floor also has numerous private dining rooms for up to forty people per room.

We started dinner with a Vesuvius shaped salad that was simply outstanding!

Judith ordered Sea Bass and I ordered a special chicken with Couscous. We looked at each other after each bite and constantly repeated, "I don't know, but it's great!" I've had Couscous in Casablanca, but it was nothing like this. It was incredible. Half way through the meal, we swapped entrees—the Sea Bass was outstanding. I topped off the meal with a Lemon Cake with fruits and vanilla ice cream. The French say, "Magnific!" The Italians say, "Bellisimo!" But I just say, "if you haven't tried it, you should and if you've been here over three months ago, come again because they change menus that often!"

Paulette Wittenberg of Inside Publications says, "It's got great food too, thanks to chef Geoff Felsenthal, who brought with him the valuable experience serving as a former chef for Charlie Trotter. In fact, there aren't too many contemporary Italian restaurants in Chicago that can match the range and variety offered by Feslenthal at

Bella Vista."

Phil Vette of the *Tribune* says "Felsenthal's creations are as complex as Bella Vista's decor. Felsenthal himself says 'The food must surpass the decor tenfold.' To that end, Felsenthal throws alot at you. The daily antipasto, for example, usually includes 10 or so distinct ingredients, from traditional inclusions such as roasted vegetables and white beans to surprise items like deep-fried beets, eggplant cannelloni, celery-root chips and tuna tartar."

DESIGNING FOR MANUFACTURING EFFECIENCY

Keith Clark, founder of K & C Design is our member sponsor of this month along with Dan and Linda Bacin. Keith joined the Chicago Region about three years ago and like all of us, he has been a car enthusiast all his life. While he has owned alot of cars, the one I think he would most like to forget the Rambler. I think we all have had Ramblers or Pacers in our lifetimes and cringe at the thought of having made such a mistake.

I first met Keith when he made a major contribution to the charity event I ran several years ago when he bought the piston set with the Andretti signatures. His wife, Karen, who works as the financial aid adminstrator for the Lincoln Technical school, was his crew member until their son Brandon was born. Brandon has since taken up all her time and the piston set has already become part of his room decor. Keith believes in getting his son into cars young--17 months! Keith also collects 1/18 scale model die cast cars that I am sure will become part of Brandon's collection of mud cars before Keith realizes that he lost them.

Keith started K & C Design around 1986 when he realized that there was a big need for manufacturing efficiency in this country. He started designing and building tooling fixtures to make production more efficient. Companies send him drawings of parts they have had difficulty producing and K

& C designs and builds gauges to check sizing and shapes in multiples. Stamped metal parts such as Lad Sanda makes at Tro Manufacturing often must be checked and rechecked to assure that they are accurate. The gauges K & C builds would allow tool makers to check for sizing quickly and accurately within .0001 of an inch. When I first asked Keith about his company, he mentioned gauges, and my reply was, did he mean tire gauges? No. Then was it gas and temperature gauges? No. Then does it have anything to do with HO model railroads? No. Well, it was obvious I didn't know what he was talking about until he explained-then it was fairly simple. The tough part is the accuracy required, yet for Keith, it's no problem.

Whereas, K & C designs the gauges, Pretech Manufacturing makes the actual gauges and fixtures for manufacturing. This is Keith's second stint with Pretech. He left them about ten years ago, but was recently made VP and partner. Pretech is a full machine shop with computer controlled machining centers which is a perfect partner for K & C. Together they offer a turnkey service for the manufacturer who needs

difficult problems solved.

Keith is a died in the wool Chicago resident—born and raised in Park Ridge. You'll find him in his 944S at the track as well as on the tech line. Be nice to him because he's the guy that gives you the sticker to get on the track, but especially because he helped sponsor our Labor Day Club Race. Give him a word of thanks although you don't have to let him beat you, just don't scratch his car when you pass him on the carousel at Road America.






