



# New Porsche Website Sparks Passion from Larry Wilson

Long Beach, CA -- The official Porsche website launched April 16 at 12:01 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, offering web fans the level of elegance, sophistication and design that Porsche has always offered auto enthusiasts.

Porsche drivers and aficionados will be welcomed to the site on the home page, then may select from four paths: The Passion of People, The Passion of Creating, The Passion of Driving and The Passion of Porsche.

Created by The Designory, inc., a firm of interactive marketing communications designers in Long Beach, (http://www.porsche-usa.com) goes live this week. The site was programmed and is being hosted by Genex Media Inc., a new media production company in Culver City, California.

"This site is designed for everybody who's ever owned, driven, admired, or looked twice at Porsche automobiles," said Lannon Tanchum, executive vice president and executive creative director of The Designory's New Media Group. "The functionality of the site is much like what you would expect from Porsche. A large volume of information about the company, its history and its people is included. This site transcends many web sites in that it has a purpose beyond boosting sales. It's intended to also expand and showcase the image of Porsche in a highly competitive market."

The rich imagery and content of the site is drawn from Porsche's historical archives, creating a rewarding volume of unique information for Porsche drivers and enthusiasts. Unlike many automotive sites, the priority of the Porsche site is to explore the mystique of the marque, rather than simply to "sell" the automobiles. Continual updates will be drawn from current pursuits and historical activities of the Porsche company.

The Porsche site is programmed with new cachebased animations that surpass current server push technology by reducing bandwidth while increasing performance. Utilizing a variety of compression techniques, Genex Media has enabled The Designory to display 24-bit color photography on the site with over 16 million colors. This offers users vivid, photo-realistic images that are not possible with 8-bit color (256 colors). The 24-bit files even occupy significantly less disk space than their 8-bit counterparts, which means they can download more quickly.

# Protect Your Porsche On The Track And Autocross

One of the questions I am most frequently asked is, "Will I damage my Porsche during PCA Driver Education and/or Autocross Events?" The answer is, if you are careful and take some precautions, you shouldn't. Normally, stone chips are about the worst damage your car will suffer at a driver's education event and cone rubs are usually the worst that an autocross has to offer. You will brake harder than you normally do on the street, so will increase brake pad wear and thus you'll see more brake dust on the wheels. The tires will take a little extra punishment, but when you consider that both activities are just about the most fun you can have with your clothes on, it's worth the extra brake and tire wear. There are a few simple things that will minimize, if not eliminate, possible damage to your car's appearance.

#### A. Wax:

The benefits of a good coat of wax can not be over emphasized. The wax will help protect the paint against everything from 100 mph bugs to autocross cone rubs. Autocross courses are outlined by rubber traffic cones and the fastest way around the course is to miss these cones. All of my cone rubs occur when I direct my car to just miss the cone and it suddenly decides to ignore my directions and, of it's own free will, jump on the cone instead. These rubs are easily removed with a little 3M Imperial Hand Glaze followed by a coat of wax. The wheel-wells and wheels will also benefit from a coat of wax. Prior to an

event, clean the wheel-wells thoroughly with a citrus degreaser such as P21S Total Auto Wash, rinse thoroughly and apply a coat of wax. Also, clean your wheels thoroughly with a quality wheel cleaner such as P21S or Sonax and give them a good coat of wax. I have found that a

couple of light coats of Sonax Spray Hard Wax provides excellent protection for both the wheels and wheel-wells and requires little buffing. After the event, be sure to thoroughly wash the car, the wheels and wheel-wells.

#### B. Nose Mask/Bra & Mirror Bras:

These are one of the most important aspects of your protection program. Of all the brands on the market, Porsche and Colgan (Colgan makes the Porsche bra) are, in my opinion, the best fitting and thus able to withstand the

higher speeds of driver education events without flapping and beating the paint to death. They are manufactured from heavy vinyl and fully lined with a soft felt. There are magnetic bras made from the same stuff as refrigerator magnets. They are usually comprised of several sections that will cover most, but not all of the nose. These gaps in protection may result in "stone chip strips". If you use racer's tape to fill in the gaps, they provide reasonable protection. Make sure you wash the car thoroughly before installing any bra, but especially magnetic bras as they have a tendency to scratch the paint if dirt is trapped underneath.

There are a few caveats concerning the use of a bra.

1. Take your time and install the bra properly the first time, as this will determine the quality of fit for the life of the bra. There are a few keys to proper installation. It takes two people to initially fit a bra. Read the directions several times. You will need a screw driver, needle nose pliers, regular slip pliers and a white grease pencil. Remove the front license plate. Lay your new bra out in the sun for several hours to smooth it out and let it get as hot as possible. With one person on each side of the car, start in the center and stretch the bra over the nose as tightly as possible. Continue stretching (with each person pulling against each other) until you have stretched/fitted it evenly to the front wheel-wells. Use your grease pencil to mark all of the tabs, on both sides, where they meet the radius of the wheel-well.

Place the side of your needle nose pliers along a line 1/4" TIGHTER than your grease pencil marks. Bend the tab into an L shape using the regular slip pliers. If you have fairly large needle nose pliers, you can use them as a jig to bend the tab into the required J shape. Continue bending the rest of the tabs 1/4" tighter than your original marks. Trial-fit the new bra and make any necessary adjustments. On 911's the hood release may have to be adjusted slightly to allow for the thickness of the bra material.

2. Make sure that your car is freshly washed and the inside of the bra is thoroughly cleaned before you install a bra. This way, you do not trap dirt underneath it, creating

"sandpaper" that will scratch the paint.

- 3. Do not leave the bra on the car for extended periods of time. The paint that is exposed to the sun will bleach out at a different rate from the areas covered by the bra. You have just created "tan lines" on your car. There are places for tan lines, but the front of your Porsche is not, in my humble opinion, one of them.
- 4. Remove a wet bra as soon as possible. We are not talking emergency slam on the brakes and rip it off type of removal, but don't let it sit on the car for a several days after it has gotten wet. The water will be trapped by the felt lining and this nice warm wet environment promotes the growth of mold. Molds produce acids that can etch your paint. So unless your Porsche has a social disease and needs the penicillin, remove the bra at your earliest opportunity.
- 5. Mirror bras are very simple to install and require no adjusting. They do wonders at preventing stone chips.

#### C. Racer's Tape:

Buy a roll of racer's tape. Racer's tape is NOT duct tape! They both use a cloth backing, but the difference lies in the adhesive. Racer's tape uses a semi-permanent adhesive, whereas duct tape uses permanent adhesive. Duct tape may gain a life-long affinity for your paint, resulting in patches of primer seeing the light of day when your paint goes home with the tape.

Racer's tape is an inexpensive way to protect areas that are not covered by a bra. You can even buy it in matching or contrasting colors and make fashion statements if you wish. Tape up the headlights, fog lights, turn signal lights, gaps in the bra and the base of the mirrors that are not covered with the mirror bra. The back radius of the front and rear wheel-wells are areas to spend time protecting with racers tape. Cover the inside lip, and outside 2-3 inches of the wheel-well opening with the tape. This is the area most likely to get stone chips. A couple of layers will prevent any but the most determined of missiles from damaging your paint.

The mirror stems are another place that should be taped. Look at your car head on from a low angle and try to visualize the areas that would be vulnerable to a rock kicked up by a car in front of you. If these areas are not covered by a bra, you may wish to use racer's tape. If some of the adhesive remains on the paint after removal of the tape, a little Oil Flo Safety Solvent on a rag will remove it. Rinse with water and apply additional wax to these areas. I would strongly suggest not taping the windshield, as this adds unnecessary guesswork to your driving experience.

#### D. Some do's and some don'ts:

I would strongly suggest that you do not apply leather

conditioner to your seats or steering wheel just prior to an event. The extra slipperiness will add a level of excitement that you don't need. I also feel strongly about not using loose fitting seat covers for the same reason. As far as the do's, keep a close watch on your fluid levels and tire pressures and most of all, HAVE A BLAST!

#### Attention To Detail: Window Glass by Matt Zakarian, Metro New York Region (from Porsche Post)

This will cover what many people find to be the most frustrating of tasks: cleaning your Porsche's windows. Dirty windows are a focal point that can make the entire vehicle feel dirty as well as be a safety hazard. Exterior glass is exposed to acid rain, insect fluids and atmospheric contaminants which can etch the surface. Interior glass is subject to smoke, vinyl evaporation film, and oily hazes from some interior dressings.

To clean windows, we need the proper chemicals, tools and techniques. The chemical is a window cleaner. These come in three flavors: ammonia, vinegar and alcohol. I suggest avoiding ammonia-based cleaners because they may harm some of the aftermarket tinting films. At my company, we use "Sprayway" glass cleaner -- a foaming, alcohol-based oldie-but-goodie.

The tools to use are window towels. This is the most important step. Whatever towels you use for your windows, use them exclusively for that. Surgical towels which are 100% cotton work best. The technique that works best is to use two window towels at a time. The first is used to work the cleaner in and the second to buff-out the glass. As soon as the "dry" towel becomes damp, don't hesitate to switch to a clean towel. This procedure should leave your windows sparkling most of the time.

Occasionally, specialized products are needed. Glass often collects mineral deposits ("water spots") and stubborn insect residue. To get rid of the insect remains, use a bug and tar remover before applying the window cleaner. Water spots usually require the use of acids or glass polish, which I suggest leaving to the pros.

I often receive questions about using newspapers to clean windows. My answer is that yes, they can do a good job because of the solvents in the ink. Using newspapers, however, makes a mess on your hands which, eventually, works its way into the car's interior. So, re-

member to use separate window towels and take your time. You, too, can have gleaming windows.

Tip of the Month: To remove new water spots on glass and paint, try using a towel you have spot-dampened with a little white vinegar.



# A Teacher's Perspective at the Drivers School

At the driver's school, April 28th, I was intrigued with the way the class was taught. As a teacher myself, I understand that sometimes it can be difficult to capture your students' attention. Ed Leed used a variety of methods throughout his morning instruction to grasp our attention and instruct at the same time.

While we were waiting for the discussion to begin we were entertained by watching a movie of Ed at Blackhawk. It was a great way to invite people to sit down and get ready for the lessons. As his lesson started he gave us a handout including illustrations and maps of various tracks.

He displayed three different, home made, colorful poster boards of ways to go into and out of a turn. His variety of boldness and color made it clear which way is the best way to accelerate through a turn. I felt much more aware of how to go through the turn. I need to break just before, and "smoothly" go into the turn, not coast but not really accelerate for a bit and then "smoothly" go out of the corner and drive fast out onto the straightaway. He made it clear that you do not want to break too soon or too late.

Another great tool Ed used was the adorable, miniature, Porsche, cloth car. It was a tool he used to demonstrate a variety of ways in which the Porsche moves. I learned all about when to put on the brakes as well as when not to. Ed demonstrated with this tool what happens when you put on the breaks while turning and while going too fast illustrating the way the car moves. He explained how the car will spin out (which has happened to me a few times) because the equilibrium changes.

Another prop Ed used was the shoe. It was great. He actually took his shoe off and demonstrated how to do the heel/toe method. He explained that the heal/toe is really a misnomer because it is really using both sides of the ball of of your right foot. I am not sure if I can do that but it was a great demonstration.

In conclusion of Ed's lesson he showed a video of previous drivers and their methods of driving. Included in the video was a discussion by one of the Skip Barber drivers, which was wonderful. He showed us how to smoothly accelerate and drive without spinning out. He also demonstrated why people spin out.

In conclusion, Ed Leed used some great teaching methods at the Spring Drivers School. I especially loved that miniature Porsche cloth car! If you did not make it this year I hope you attend next year. I learned a lot. Thanks Ed.

#### ROAD AMERICA II DRIVERS SCHOOL AUGUST 31-SEPTEMBER 2, 1996

Road America II is fast approaching and there are a few changes that will be in effect for this weekend. The first change and one of the most important is the dates. Please note that it is a 3 day event this year...Saturday, Sunday and Monday. This is because Road America II and the PCA Club Racing will be held as a joint event. The usual procedures will be in place with run groups alternating every half hour, with passing allowed only in designated areas. Each driver will have more driving sessions than our Road America Memorial Day weekend, but they will be spread out over the three days of the event.

Please note that for the Labor Day event only experienced drivers can participate in the event. There will be no novice drivers or novice run groups on this weekend.

All cars must display numbers on each side of their car plus on the front. Shoe polish is not acceptable. Numbers must be large enough for the corner workers to see clearly or you will be black flagged. Also, all cars running at Road America must meet a noise restriction of 108db. It is the responsibility of each driver to insure their car does not exceed this noise restriction.

The Chicago Region PCA is staging what we hope will be the premier Drivers Education and Club Race event of the 1996 season. The reviews from last year's event were great and we are working hard to make it even better this year. We will again host a party, dinner and concours at Siebkin's on Saturday night. The dinner will be an outdoor buffet (weather permitting) and will be free to all drivers and volunteers. Additional tickets will be \$15 for adults, \$8 for children. We need lots of volunteers for this event, so maybe a family member or one of your pit crew would like to help us out.

Spaces are limited, and we highly recommend that you register early. You will be notified of your acceptance by mail. Also, please remember that you must present a valid driver's license and your PCA membership card at registration.

All corners will be staffed by professional SCCA corner workers. The corner workers will be strictly enforcing the passing rules with no passing being allowed in the corners.

Using your Chicago Region Tech Sheet, it is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car yourself, or have it checked by a competent service organization immediately prior to the event. Be sure to pay close attention to the specifics on the tech sheet concerning brake fluids and brake pads.

The mandatory clothing requirements remain a 1985 Snell approved helmet, a long sleeved shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of a non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not mandatory, are drivers suits and driving gloves made of nonflammable materials, fire extinguisher, and a safety harness.

The Saturday, Sunday and Monday MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETINGS will be held at 7:30 am at the track. Anyone missing the mandatory drivers meetings will not drive.

Registration opens at Road America on Friday afternoon at 4:00 pm. The tech crew will be on hand to scrutinize your car. If your car is not teched at Road America on Friday, it must be teched at the track on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. No car will be allowed to run without a tech sticker.

Siebken's will again be the headquarters for the non-track meetings. Contact Siebken's directly for lodging reservations (414-876-2600). Continental breakfast will be available at 6:00 am, with full service breakfast starting at 9:00 am. Siebken's is attempting to provide full service breakfast earlier for the drivers, but this information will only be available at registration.




