

Bacino's will be catering this event for the club. Choices will be sandwiches or pizza. Bacino's will contact you prior to the event for your selection.



Here's your opportunity to practice all that you've learned in drivers school in the complete safety of an enclosed high-speed track. Blackhawk is an eight turn 1.8 mile track that is located just outside of Rockton, Illinois close to the Northwest Tollway. To save time at the track-you may bring a letter from a recognized Porsche dealer or mechanic stating that your car has been prepared for the track.

TECH BEGINS AT 8:30 AM

The first Road America driving school of the year is soon to be a reality. The usual procedures will be in place...run groups alternating every half hour of open track lapping. Plenty of track time to practice those turns, learn those lines and have fun.

The first Road America becomes even more fun this year because the Chicago Region is going racing again on the Labor Day weekend. This would be a perfect time for the racers to learn the Road America track and set-up their cars for the racing event.

On Friday night, May 26th, the novice drivers will be required to attend the novice drivers meeting at Siebken's. On Saturday, the novice drivers must attend a half day Skip Barber drivers school to learn the proper driving techniques for cornering, braking, safety practices, and the safe negotiation of the track. The novices will then have the opportunity to drive the track while being observed and critiqued by Skip Barber instructors and accompanied by their personal PCA instructors, then they will be able to join in the alternating run groups for the rest of the weekend.

Again, all corners will be staffed by professional SCCA corner worker. The corner workers will be strictly enforcing the rules of passing (restricted to certain straight aways), with no passing being allowed in the braking areas or turns.

Using your Chicago Region Tech Sheet, it is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car yourself, or have it checked by a competent service organization immediately prior to the event. Be sure to pay close attention to the specifics on the tech sheet concerning brake fluids and brake pads.

The mandatory clothing requirements remain that a 1985 Snell approved helmet (PLEASE NOTE..WE REPEAT..A 1985 SNELL APPROVED HELMET), a long sleeved shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of a non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not mandatory, are drivers suits and driving gloves made of nonflammable materials, fire extinguisher, and a safety harness.

Once each day there will be an opportunity to run Parade laps with your family or other passengers over 18 years of age wearing a 1985 Snell approved helmet and appropriate clothing and wearing a seat belt. Speed will be contained by a use of pace cars and any make of car is acceptable as long as it is in appropriate condition.

Again, there will be a MANDATORY NOVICE DRIVERS MEETING at Siebkens promptly at 8:00 pm Friday evening. The novices will be given general instructions as well as pertinent information as to the format and rules of the event. All novices MUST attend this meeting or they will not be allowed to drive.

The Saturday and Sunday MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETINGS will be at 7:30 am at the track. ANYONE MISSING THE MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETINGS WILL NOT DRIVE.

Registration opens at Siebkens on Friday afternoon at 4:00 pm. The tech crew will be on hand to scrutinize your car. If your car is not teched at Siebkens on Friday, it must be teched at the track on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. No car will be allowed to run without a tech sticker.

A sellout is a "sure thing" for this event, so please register early. You will be notified of your acceptance by mail by the registrar. Also, please remember that you must present a VALID DRIVERS LICENSE at the time of registration.

NEW THIS YEAR AND FOR ALL FUTURE ROAD AMERICA EVENTS, ROAD AMERICA HAS IMPOSED A NOISE LEVEL RESTRICTION. THE RESTRICTION IS 108DB FOR ALL CARS. ROAD AMERICA ITSELF WILL BE MONITORING THIS NOISE RESTRICTION, AND IF YOUR AUTOMOBILE EXCEEDS THE LIMITS, ROAD AMERICA WILL ASK YOU TO LEAVE.

Also new this year are restrictions from Road America about roller blades and skateboards are prohibited.

Siebkens will be again be the "headquarters" for the non-track meetings. Contact Siebkens directly for lodging reservations (414-876-2600). Dinner reservations for Saturday night can be made at the same time as room reservations, but please no latter than Friday evening, May 26th. Dinner choices are Weinerschnitzel, Duck, Prime Rib, and Fresh Fish if ordered in advance.

The Chicago membership is again coming to the forefront with sponsorship in our race program. George and Brian Weathered were the first to sign up for their third year in a row and now Martin Saltzman has signed on for his second year. He has offered to sponsor not only our race, but our Memorial Day driver's Education event as well. He wasn't able to make it to our race last year but he promises to make it to both events this year. The large number of sports medicine "spin outs" seem to be keeping him from the track where he wants

to practice not "spinning" himself.

Over the past few months, there have been news reports that most of the back problems we suffer are muscular and not disc related. This is good news because muscle problems can usually be fixed with proper exercise. Many of these problems result from our poor physical condition relating to lifestyles and the general "abuse" put on our bodies--such as sleeping on our stomachs in bed, laying on the couch (slouching) for long periods of time, using poor chairs and/or improperly bending while lifting heavy objects. How many times can you recall when you bent over to pick up a moderately heavy box? One's driving position can also play an important part in the health of our backs. Not only on the track, but also on your drive to and from work.

Simple lifestyle changes can help reduce chances of injury. As mother always told youdon't slouch. Even when you are tired, sit up straight with the back of the seat to keep your spine in a straight line. One of the big mistakes people make with muscle aches is to use a hot pad instead of an ice pack. Ice promotes constriction of the muscle and reduces any inflamation.

Another problem with our lifestyles and our hobbies is that we tend to sit all week long and then go all out on the weekend. Some weekend warriors get out on the tennis court and play hard, or out on the golf course and swing hard. We weekend roadsters get on the track and push our cars, carry heavy tool boxes, lift tires off racks, move hydraulic jacks around and undeniably over stretch our muscles.

For these reasons, and many others, you need to know Martin Saltzman. Talk to him about how to make your weekend enjoyable while avoiding the limping on Monday and Tuesday. He has had his sports medicine clinic since 1984, over which time he has helped hundreds of weekend warriors. There are a number of drivers who think they have to give up track events or racing due to their back problems. Martin can help to determine if such drastic measures are necessary, or if some lifestyle changes or fitness programs could help to keep them in the drivers seat. If you see him around the tracks or if you have minor back problems, call for a consultation.

Mad about June, Mike Gallagher


Dear "Mad about June" Mike,

JAMES DEAN MISCONCEPTION

The December 13, 1993 issue of "Autoweek" had an excellent article on the James Dean mystique entitled "Rebels Without a Cause", eulogized as part of the rack-and-roll culture and the car shows in his honor center around the American hot-rods in his famous movie "Rebels Without a Cause", he actually was just the opposite. He was a jazz buff, and he drove European cars-he owned an MG roadster, two Porsches (a Speedster and the Spyder he was killed in), and a Triumph motorcycle; the only American cars he drove were a '49 Ford he drove in high school and a Ford station wagon used to tow his race cars.

What is just as interesting is what happened to the Porsche Spyder he was killed in after his infamous accident. It slipped off the tow truck and broke a mechanic's leg. The smashed body was used in a traveling road-safety show and fell off it's platform, breaking a teenager's hip. It was transported to the next

stop on a flatbed truck that got rear-ended by a following car whose driver was thrown out upon impact, and as he lay in the road the treacherous Spyder dropped off the truck, rolled over the fellow, and killed him. In Oregon, the transporter's brakes failed and it smashed into a storefront.

Whilte mounted on supports in New Orleans, the Porsche itself literally disintegrated, breaking into eleven parts. Then, while being shipped back to Los Angeles by train, it vanished.

The "Autoweek" article auther (Sam Moses) noted "I saw a TV show last summer that recreated James Dean's crash by computer, and concluded that he wasn't even speeding".


