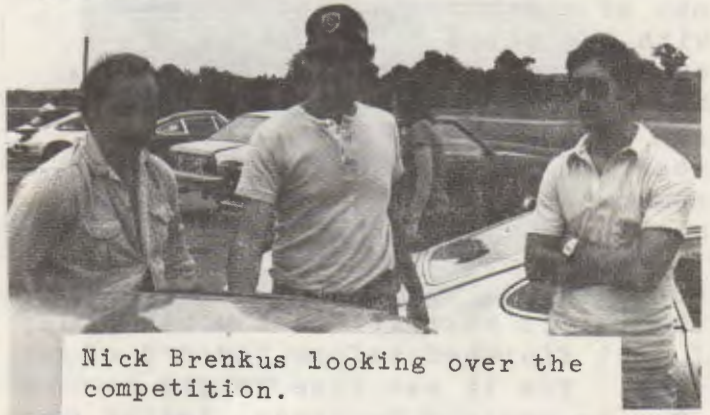

(Registration will close at noon. Be there before that or you will not be admitted.)

If you enjoyed Elkhart, you will love the 11th annual eight hours at Blackhawk. Once again you will have the opportunity to learn high speed handling and safety techniques in complete safety and to get in a little practice before the second Elkhart weekend.

By virtue of the fact that this is being held on a weekday, the track rental is less expensive and the course should not be crowded. For all of those who desire, several well qualified instructors will be present to help you learn proper shifting, braking and cornering techniques.

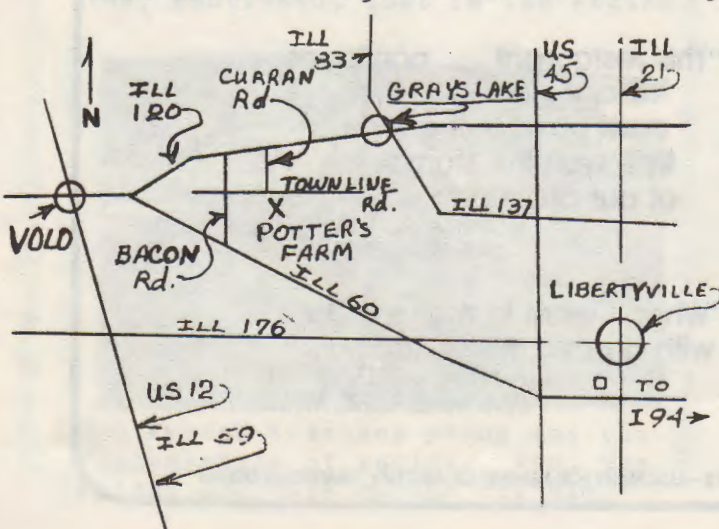
We will be running our usual four concours classes, remember that class "D" doesn't even count the trunk, so plan to enter even if you only wash the outside and vacuum the interior.

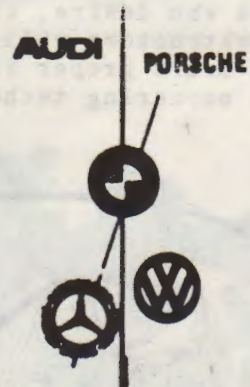

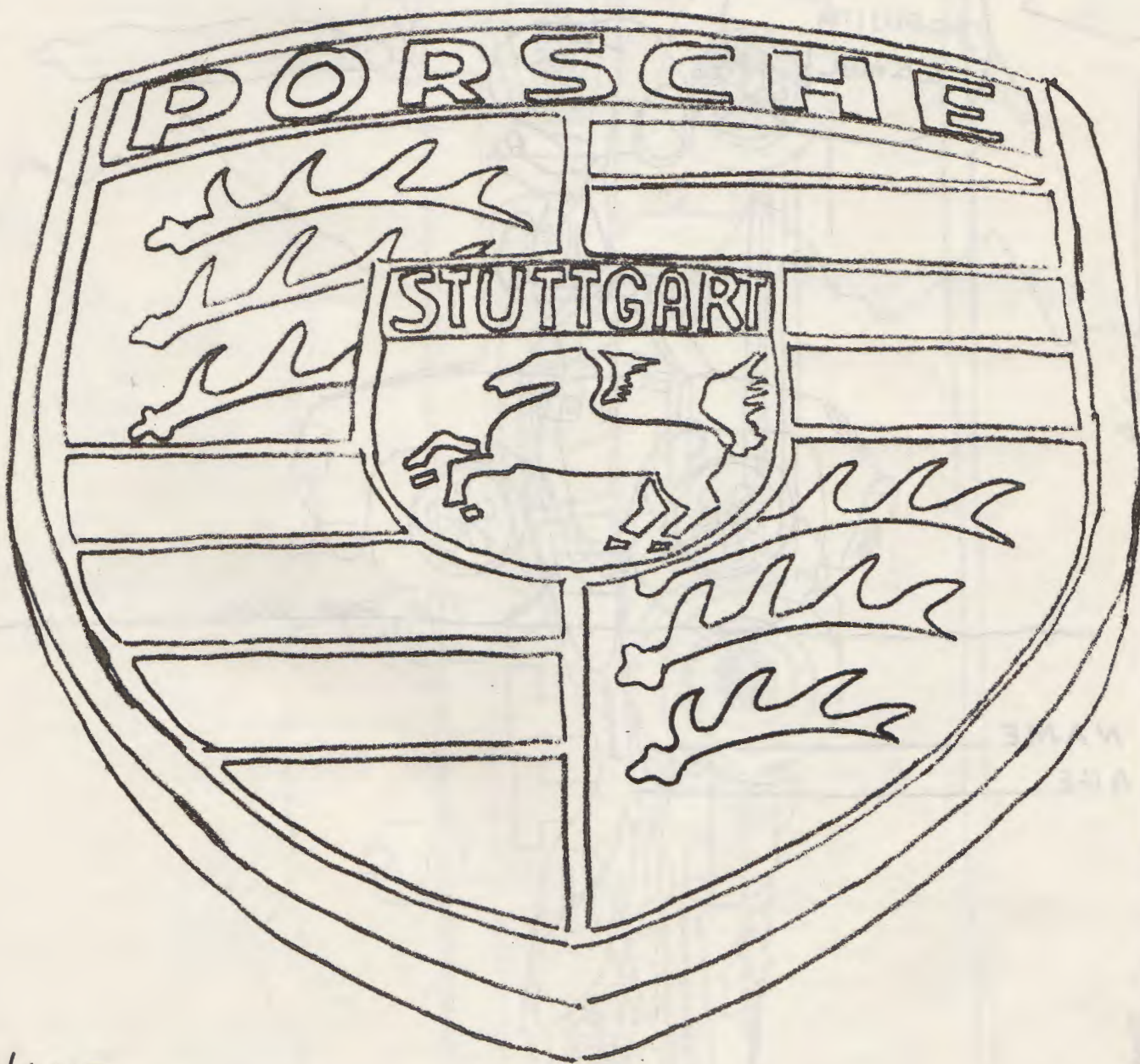
PORSCHE+AUDI HOST COCKTAIL PARTY
